

How you can help keep New Zealand's foreshore & seabed in Crown Ownership



Send in a submission before 19 Nov - it only takes a few minutes!

The Situation:

Unless it is withdrawn, John Key's *Marine and Coastal Area Bill* will become law by the end of summer. It will start the carve-up of the coast to corporate iwi. As drafted, the Bill will give iwi separate legal powers including the right to develop and mine the coast, veto other users, charge access to the coast for fishing, boating, surfing and all beach-related activities in Maori-controlled areas, as well as ban the public from places they say are *wahi tapu* (sacred) with no rights of appeal and fines of up to \$5,000! Tribal claims for what amounts to the privatisation of billions of dollars worth of public resources will not need to be tested in an open court of law, but will be able to be settled through secret backroom deals with friendly Ministers.

No Public Mandate:


John Key has no mandate for trading 2,000 km (one tenth) of your coast for Maori Party votes. The Maori Party has already said that this Bill to repeal Crown ownership is not enough. They say they won't stop until our whole 200-mile Exclusive Economic Zone is in Maori Title.

What's at Stake:

The Crown owned foreshore and seabed is the common heritage of all New Zealanders as equal citizens. It is a priceless natural resource consisting of 10 million hectares of beach and sea out to the 12 nautical mile limit, all harbours and estuaries, the airspace above and the non-nationalised minerals below. According to Crown Minerals, New Zealand's iron sands reserves alone are worth \$1 trillion. Crown ownership guarantees free and unfettered public access, and ensures that all proceeds from leases and royalties from commercial coastal operations go to local and central government for use in the national interest.

Help Stop the Bill:

You can help stop this Bill by putting in a submission to the Select Committee by November 19th. To mail your submission, send two copies to the Secretariat, Maori Affairs Select Committee, Parliament Buildings, Wellington. Or you can make your submission on-line *now* by following three simple steps:

1. Visit Parliament's Select Committee website - Click [here>>>](#)
2. Navigate to the on-line submission form - Scroll down, enter the authorisation code (keep hitting 'refresh'  if it's hard to read), then click through to the submission form (try pressing Ctrl while you click if it's difficult).
3. Make your submission - Enter your contact details, state clearly that you oppose the bill and want it withdrawn, outline your reasons either directly on the form or by uploading a pre-prepared file, and indicate whether you would like to make an oral submission. That's all there is to it!
