NEW PLYMOUTH PETITION - MAORI SEATS ON COUNCIL

The New Plymouth District Council has voted to introduce Maori Wards and Maori seats at the next election. This was against the wishes of the wider community.

One councillor resigned as a result of the decision.

This controversial proposal can be challenged by locals through a binding referendum.

The Nelson community successfully challenged a similar decision by their council a few years ago, by overwhelmingly voting against Maori Wards in a binding referendum. Other councils, such as the Far North District Council have decided that it is residents and ratepayers who should decide on whether race-based seats are introduced, since it is such an important constitutional change. Accordingly, they are holding a referendum on the issue next year.

Local New Plymouth resident Hugh Johnson has launched a petition calling for a binding referendum on whether or not Maori Wards and Maori seats should be introduced.

He needs around 3,500 signatures by 2 March 2015.

- (b) If this petition is successful, the wording of the referendum to be held next year, is: "Should a Maori Ward be established in the New Plymouth District?"
